

WAYNE BABER

Temple, Tx

Wayne Baber of Temple, Texas is a longstanding member of the Texas Limousin Association (TLA). Baber served on the TLA board for over six years, two of those as President of the association. His granddaughters, Reagan Bauer and Randa Taylor were active members of the TJLA, both serving as Presidents of the junior board. Randa also served as the North American Limousin Junior Association's President.

How did you get involved with the breed and Texas Limousin Association?

Before I retired, a friend of mine, who is more like my brother, bought a show heifer for his daughter and he and I kind of became partners. It happened to be a Limousin. So before I retired and moved to the country, I bought a cow or two. And since we started with a Limousin, we just kind of stuck with the breed.

The French history and all was kind of

interesting but I didn't know anything about anything, so we just decided to go with it. We made a few sales back when there were some big breeders in Texas, not out of knowing anything in particular, it just sounded like they were going to do good and if we wanted to buy some cows, we might as well have some registered cows.

I do remember, I went in to stay and help a family out in Houston one year, and this poor kid had an Angus and they walked him in and just walked him right back out. Half of them walked in and half of them didn't even get to show. I thought, that is so bad, I couldn't believe they didn't give those kids the opportunity to walk around the ring at least. They had so many heifers, that after sitting there for 3 days, some didn't even get to show. It was another reason I thought I'm not going to do an Angus. I just couldn't believe what they did that day and after that I just knew I didn't want to raise Angus. When I did retire and actually moved where I had some acreage, I bought a few more cows. I never had more

than 25 or 30. Of course, I developed a lot of friends in the association. The grandkids were interested and Limousin just seemed to be the way to go. Nothing fantastic, just kind of evolved into it. They enjoyed it and the people they were meeting and the work ethic they were learning, they were really enjoying it, so I was fortunately able to help them be involved. Randa especially still has several friends that she met from the association.

How has the Limousin breed changed since you began raising the cattle?

I certainly think it's a cross breed. I was one of the ones that wanted to keep the breed red and that wasn't the right thing and it took them a while to convince me. Someone told me, 'what you've got to look at is what is the market buying, that's what you have to work for'. And of course, they weren't buying Fullblood Limousins. They were buying something with a black hide.

Through the cross-breeding, they've been able to increase the marbling and make it a better piece of meat. The Angus Association has done just such a job on selling. They've just been able to do the marketing, and the marbling does make it taste better. If you take a piece of Fullblood Limousin, if you over-cook it at all, it's going to be tough. But the change has evolved to make it a better piece of meat.

There were some people that realized that in the beginning, that Fullblood red wasn't the way to go. In other words, it makes a very good bull to cross with a range cow and come up with a better piece of meat.

Why do you think it's important to be involved in a breed association?

I retired and did it for fun and to stay with the grandkids. You can buy great animals but you had more fun when you showed one you raised, you just enjoyed that more. The junior association is just really, really good for the kids - the work ethics and the friendships that come from being involved is invaluable.

All my favorite memories are just seeing how well the juniors do and just how much my grandkids learned and the work ethic and the friends they made.

What is your favorite memory from your involvement with the Limousin breed?

Oh wow. All my favorite memories are just seeing how well the juniors do and just how much my grandkids learned and the work ethic and the friends they made. That's been the biggest thing I got out of it.

Probably the favorite show would have been the second Junior Nationals in Amarillo, the red-dirt. I was just more involved in that one and it was just a neat activity. I was in charge of finance for that

show and it was just pretty cool to see how people, that didn't get along all the time, to see

how much they were willing to contribute to make that thing a real success. Which has been the case at all of them.

So, just the people and what they do for the kids is really the best thing I've gotten out of the association.

Do you have any advice for new members of the association?

Just listen to the group that's leading the junior show - ask them for advice and listen. The ones that are leading and doing it are willing to help you out. You can't beat the group that works with the juniors which is pretty much the same group all the time and you can't beat the advice and help that they give you.

Beef & Broccoli Stir Firs

Get out the wok, or cook it stovetop and skip the takeout with this homemade beef and broccoli stir fry. Make it as is, or add your own additional veggies.

Serving Size: 4

Cook Time: 30 minutes



Step 01

Begin cooking rice to be ready when the stir fry is done.

Step 02

Combine sauce ingridients into one bowl, stir and set aside.

Step 03

Add 1 tsp of oil to a large skillet over medium heat. Add broccoli florets and sauté 4-5 minutes, partially covered with lid, stirring throughout until broccoli is crisp-tender. If you prefer softer broccoli, add 2 tbsp of water before covering the pan to steam to cook. Once ready, remove from pan and set aside.

Step 04

Tenderize beef and slice into thin strips. Increase to high heat and add more oil. Add beef in a single layer and sauté 2 minutes per side or just until cooked through.

Step 05

Add broccoli and sauce to the beef, reduce heat to medium/low. If a thinner sauce is desired, stir in 1-2 tbsp of water. Simmer 3-4 minutes. Serve over white rice.





